	The Registrar explained why the case was again being brought before the Council, after a decision had been taken at the last meeting. The legal technical advisor had not commented on the circulated report by the stipulated deadline. It was therefore assumed that she had no comments and agreed to the recommendations therein. The report and recommendations were presented to the council at the fourth meeting in May 2016. She later submitted a set of recommendations which differed totally from what had been discussed and agreed upon during the meetings of the investigation committee.
